4. The decision heralded a break with the the old regime and raised the **prospect** of further deregulation of the financial system.
5. The formation of the trade union raises **issues** about Buddhism in Japan, and about the age-old relationships between God, people, and money.
6. The Government's objective was to raise **awareness** of what was achieved during the Normandy campaign and pay tribute to campaign veterans.
7. Seventy years after Emiliano Zapata began raising his rebel **army**, land and the need for agrarian reform remain the two issues for the majority in Chapas.
8. Esther Lamont, wife of the senior keeper at Mull of Kintyre lighthouse, raised the **alarm** after hearing a huge explosion and seeing a fireball plunging from the sky.
9. The incident has raised fresh **fears** about safety standards in the Chinese aviation market, where airlines have been plagued by crashes, hijackings and safety violations,
10. The IRA ceasefire has raised **hopes** among a small and all but forgotten group of victims of the Troubles in Northern Ireland - the families of people who have disappeared.
